Stabling: The CCI and CIC athletes will be stabled in a separate marquee. The athletes will have the option of 2.5m x 5m partition @ R500 for weekend or 2.5m x 2.5 m @ R275 for weekend.
A limited number of marquee and scaffolding stables will be available - 2.5m x 2.5 m @ R275 for weekend or 2.5m x 5m @ R500 for weekend.

Grooms: N.B. Athletes are reminded that all grooms must have a Security Card. Please check the Groom form for more information.

Prize Money: Minimum of 40% of entry fees after levies (or net entries) for SANEF classes and minimum of 60% of entry fees after levies (or net entries) plus sponsorship for FEI classes

Rules and Regulations

1. All classes will be run under KZNHS and SANEF 1st May 2010 Eventing Rules.
2. Entries from outside KwaZulu-Natal must be countersigned by the Regional Body concerned, as being in order.
3. All tack will be checked before the commencement of each test. As per Eventing Rules 45.4.2 and 45.7.3, protective headgear, medical cards and body protectors are obligatory for the Cross Country test. Surcingles are strongly recommended.
4. Athletes shall wear the correct dress at all times whilst warming up and in the arena.
5. Objections lodged must adhere to Appendix GR/B of the SANEF General Regulations and Section 43 of the Eventing Rules.
6. Regional, KZNHS membership must be up to date for all Classes. The organising committee reserves the right to restrict class entries strictly on a first come basis. **NO CHANGES BETWEEN CLASSES WILL BE ALLOWED AFTER THE CLOSING DATE OF ENTRIES.**
7. Faxed entries will only be accepted if accompanied by a stamped deposit slip, which should clearly state **187 plus Rider's Name** as reference. Proof of payment must be supplied if entry fees are paid via electronic funds transfer - use **187 plus Rider's Name** as reference.
8. Any requests for a specific riding order **MUST** be clearly indicated on the entry form. It is the responsibility of the athlete to make sure their entries have been received. All dressage tests used are from the 2009 Eventing Dressage Test book.
9. The Show Holding Body reserves the right to alter or vary the programme in light of prevailing conditions at their discretion, with the approval of the Technical Delegate.
10. The Organising Committee, the Show Holding Body, KZNHS, SANEF and Treverton Schools, cannot be held liable for any loss, damage, death or injury to people, horses or property whatsoever. All athletes and spectators enter the premises entirely at their own risk.
11. Ponies/horses may compete from the 1 August of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 4 years for Eventing .80m and below and 5 years for Eventing .90m and Eventing 1.00m classes.
12. The Cross Country course will be open for inspection on foot from 14h00 Thursday 10th June 2010. This is regarded as the official starting time of the event so all eventing rules (including restrictions with regard to dress and saddlery) will be enforced. As from the closing date of entries, no athlete/competing horse may ride in the vicinity of the cross country obstacles, until called upon to do so under penalty of elimination. At the event venue and after the official opening of the course for inspection, and for the duration of the event, it is forbidden under penalty of disqualification for anyone other than the athlete who will ride the horse in the competition to school a horse.
13. **Any horse that has not been officially entered for the event will not be allowed access to the show grounds without prior permission from the Chairman of the Organising Committee.**
14. **Numbers are to be collected before the Dressage Test and are to be worn for all 3 Tests.** Bridle numbers are permitted. If you are not in possession of an Eventing Vest they can be purchased for R100. Please indicate and pay with your entry.
15. Athletes please note that Medical cards are compulsory and must be clearly visible on the rider, preferably on the arm. Medical cards and holders can be purchased at R40 and collected when you get your numbers. Please indicate and pay with your entry.

16. Owners, riders and horses must be registered with a regional body. Associate members may only compete in Eventing .80m and below.
17. Parking in designated areas only. **Dogs will only be allowed if on leads at all times.**
18. A complete list of SANEF General Regulations, Veterinary Regulations, Eventing Rules and Eventing Dressage Tests can be found on the SANEF website www.horsesport.org.za. No dressage test will be supplied so athletes must ensure that they have the correct copies.
19. Please note: Treverton Equestrian Centre's stables and paddocks are out of bounds.
20. All stallions must have a yellow disc on both sides of the bridle or have a yellow ribbon in the tail.
21. **EQUINE FLU VACS MUST BE ADMINISTERED WITHIN 6 MONTHS OF THE DATE OF THE EVENT.**

**CODE OF CONDUCT
FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE**

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. *At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.*
2. *Horses and athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.*
3. *Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.*
4. *Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.*
5. *The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.*
